THE TROUBLED LIFE OF AMELIA EARHART

This is a biography about Amelia Earhart. She was born in Atchison, Kansas, on July 24, 1897. Ever since she's experienced days where she felt like she was flying she has always wanted to try it. After a flight with Frank Hawks, she wanted to fly, then took flying lessons with Neta Snook in 1921. In the same year Amelia Earhart bought her first plane and decided to name it the Kinner Airster. In 1931, she planned a world flight and took off on March 17 and crashed on the runway then rescheduled. She

took off again later, and landed in New Guinea. When she was on her way to Howland Island she couldn't find the location of it and started losing gas. She went missing and there was a two-year search and was never found. This still remains a mystery today how she was lost from her flight.
